STATUTORY DECLARATION

I (1) Emma Elizabeth Giles, wife of Alfred Giles, Contractor "Newbury", High St., Carlton E. S. W., do solemnly and sincerely declare (2)---

That No. 2338 Corporal Henry Thomas Walter Brown, now on Active Service abroad is my illegitimate son. He was born on the Twenty-ninth day of April 1893 at Macquarie Pass, near Albion Park New South Wales, and his father was Archibald Thomas Keever, whose present address is unknown to me. I registered the birth at Woolloongong and I gave the above-stated facts regarding his birth. I reared him until he was nine years of age, when I married William Blackwood at Woolloongong New South Wales, when my son Henry Thomas Walter Brown went to live with my aunt's husband Henry Keever, Forest Road Hurstville. He did not live with me until he was about nineteen years of age. My son did not go to live with Henry Keever in Queensland. I did not see him after his enlistment in the A. I. F. As far as I know my son is not married and is under no lawful obligation to support any person, and I respectfully request that my son's military allotment be paid into the Commonwealth Bank to his credit.

And I make this solemn declaration by virtue of the Statutory Declarations Act, 1911, conscientiously believing the statements contained therein to be true in every particular.

(b) A Commissioner for Affidavits, or
(c) A Commissioner for Declarations.
